Jesus Christ, the Light of the World



The Lord is my light and my salvation... Psalm 27:1

When Jesus spoke again to the people, He said, 'I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.' John 8:12

For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ. 2 Corinthians 4:6

The people living in Alaska or Scandinavia live in total darkness for a couple of months each year. Darkness is the absence of light, but in many places of the world, there is not real darkness even when the sun goes down. We have dimmed the sky with ambient light-light reflected upward from the many lights of our towns and cities. About 20 years ago, the nearby Palomar Observatory complained about all the lights in our area interfering with their views of the sky. When we lived in the Philippines, we experienced several typhoons which took out the electricity for miles around. In one such event, we were without electricity for 3 weeks. When the sun goes down in the tropics, it is instantly dark. This time, there was no light for 100 miles in all directions. (If you want to know how dark that is, go into a closet and shut the door. Until you turn the light on, the darkness is total.)

learned a lot from that candle. When I was away from the candle the light was dim and far away. As I moved nearer to the light, it got brighter. When I carried the candle with me, the light surrounded me. It seemed even brighter than when I just beheld it. That's the way it is with Jesus. The closer we get to Jesus, through prayer, worship and Bible study, the brighter things get.

The lights of the world around us can lead us to destruction. There are marguees and signs around us offering exciting activities designed to lead us astray. We see things advertized on TV, movies, games, programs that are available at little to no charge. Life can be one big party if we let it. Pills and drugs to lift us up, put us down, help us to sleep, wake us up, or keep us going are available everywhere. Legal or not. The world calls out to us, selling ways to be perfect on the outside. It doesn't worry about what is inside, the ugliness, despair or pain. God sent Jesus so that we could be freed from this darkness. God sent Jesus to break the darkness, to break your darkness. God's Holy Spirit calls you to turn from this darkness and look to the light and live in the light of Jesus.

Unfortunately, there are people who live a life of darkness even when there isn't a power outage. Fear, ambition, selfishness, loneliness, or the constant search for "more" leads them on. The light of Christ is dimmed or blocked and they don't see it. There is a candle available but they don't use it.

To avoid being caught with no light, I always lit the candle before dark. And then, I learned another thing about the light of the candle. The light was hard to see mixed in with the daylight or if I was busy with other things. It was there, but I had to look for it. It is the same with the Light of Jesus. It is there. We just have to look to it.



Sometimes, the darkness overcomes us when we aren't expecting it—the loss of a loved one or of a job, a serious illness. Maybe we just get overwhelmed by everyday things. As the darkness overwhelms us, Jesus' Light shines brighter. If we are far away in darkness, the Light draws us nearer and we can see the way more fully. Finally, when we are next to the Light, we can see the way to continue in the Light, going anywhere and doing anything. Because the Light of Jesus shines in us, we are to be the light to the world.

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden...let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14, 16

In what way have you shared His Light with someone lately? How might we share His Light with those in darkness? By inviting our friends and neighbors to worship with us. A lot of people pray before eating. Try praying publicly, even out loud, when you eat out. There are many ways e can be lights for Christ. Think about them and pray about them. Take part in the various Bible Studies, volunteer for committees and boards and invite your friends to join you.

You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. You show that you are a letter from Christ, the result of our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts. 2 Corinthians 3:2-3
