Facing the Cross

Invocation

- P In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.
- P I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.
- C For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."
- P The word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing,
- C but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

Confession and Absolution

(From Luke 9:51, Eph. 4:31-32, 1 Cor. 1:10, and Eph. 2:13-16)

- P When the days drew near for him to be taken up, Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem to die on the cross for us.
- C So we set our faces to the cross of Christ this day, and face the fact that we have not always dealt well with one another.

- P St. Paul said, "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice."
- C We confess that there have been times we have been angry with one another and have not treated people with respect and we ask for your forgiveness.
- P St. Paul said, "I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment."
- C We confess that there have been times when we built up barriers between us when we should be tearing down walls of discord and we ask for your forgiveness.
- P Find rest in these words, "But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility.
- C Just as we are reconciled to God through Christ, so we are reconciled to one another.
- P So be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.
- C We thank you, Jesus, for facing each one of us and loving us in spite of our sin. Help us to face each other with love and forgiveness every day of our lives. Amen.


From sorrow, toil and pain, And sin, we shall be free, And perfect love and friendship reign Through all eternity.
