As Thanksgiving Day approaches, I wonder, "What will motivate us to be thankful this year and beyond?"

God's Word instructs us to be thankful all the time. "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him" (Colossians 3:17).

What would make us thankful in all circumstances? Colossian 3:1 gives insight: "If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God" (Colossians 3:1). Thankfulness emanates from our Baptism where we were endowed with new life and a perspective that overcomes the emotional confusion of our struggle in this world. "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in vour hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16).

May God direct and bless our thankfulness on this Thanksgiving Day and beyond!




NEW Adult Bible Fellowship Thursdays @ 7:00pm Begins November 30, 2017



November MASS News!

Dear Mr. Campbell,

Thank you for taking the time to contact each one of your previous seminarians. I am both proud and happy to speak on behalf of MASS at any time; you are welcome to use this letter at any time in the future for such purposes.

In the Spring of 2007, I was one of the first applicants to be denied admission to the seminary due to the amount of debt I was going to carry in with me. While it was understandably responsible of them to begin to make those decisions, it certainly came as a shock. I had taken the financial step of faith of large student loans in order to attend Concordia University, Irvine, for the express purpose of preparing myself for seminary. In bitter irony, I was then denied the opportunity to attend seminary because of those very loans.

At that point, my future father-in-law at the time, Rev. Dennis Stueve, spearheaded a significant campaign on my behalf. He contacted countless family, friends, and other connections, requesting monetary pledges for each of the three years of study. During that time, another previous seminarian of yours, and my brother-in-law, Rev. Aaron Smith, referred my name to MASS for support. That began a relationship I will always be grateful for.

As a result of the pledges and gifts given, I was granted admission to the seminary. During those four years of pastoral formation, my fiancé and then wife, Kari, and I worked our tails off. In addition to my full-time studies during the week and fieldwork responsibilities at a nearby congregation, I also worked Friday and Saturday evenings as a valet, parking cars at fancy restaurants, dependent on tips. Though we had received enough commitments to cover the entire cost of my seminary education, the Recession hit hard in the midst of that, and Kari and I became *cautiously* hopeful that all those pledges would come in. We made an intentional effort to live on as little support as possible, squirrelling away whatever we could just in case the 'well' dried up. Praise God! It never did.

In the Spring of 2011, I graduated from seminary and received my first Call as Associate Pastor at Trinity Lutheran Church & School in Bend, Oregon. Not only were Kari and I able to carry less loan debt than we had four years prior, but we had also stored away enough of what we had been earning to afford a down payment on a foreclosed house while the market was still near the bottom.

Please understand how critical that has been for us: the cost of living in this tourist town has made it to where the monthly rent of a 1-bedroom apartment is comparable to the mortgage payment of a 3bedroom house. Your support allowed us to afford the latter, which gave us the opportunity to truly be at home here, building a 'nest' for ourselves and eventually a family. We now have two boys: John is 4½, and Samuel turns 2 the day I write this.

In the Spring of last year (2016), we realized we had been blessed with another opportunity for our family. In those five years, the housing market had recovered, and the demand for housing in Bend began to bustle again as families and businesses choose to relocate here, often to be near God's beautiful Creation that surrounds us. With the amount our home had appreciated, not only were we able to afford a new house in an incredibly family-friendly neighborhood (there are over 20 kids on our cul-de-sac alone!), we were also able to use a chunk of the proceeds to pay off my remaining balance of student loan debt. Praise God! MASS's goal – debt free.

I know my story is long, but I love sharing it with whoever I can. And, quite simply and powerfully, the bottom line is this: Kari, John, Samuel, and I would NOT be in the position we are today without the support of the men and congregations in your desert communities who have dedicated themselves to supporting pastoral formation. From the bottom of our hearts, we are so thankful for what God has done and continues to do through all of you.

An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

The first Veterans Day under the new law was observed with much confusion on October 25, 1971. It was quite apparent that the commemoration of this day was a matter of historic and patriotic significance to a great number of our citizens, and so on September 20th, 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed Public Law 94-97 (89 Stat. 479), which returned the annual observance of Veterans Day to its original date of November 11, beginning in 1978. This action supported the desires of the overwhelming majority of state legislatures, all major veterans service organizations and the American people

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. The restoration of the observance of Veterans Day to November 11 not only preserves the historical significance of the date, but helps focus attention on the important purpose of Veterans Day: A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.
