"About Face"

- **P** Seek the LORD while he may be found; call on him while he is near.

Confession and Absolution

Lord, we are now nearing the time when your Son faces death on the cross. As we see him humbly preparing to die for us, teach us the folly of pride; teach us to bear our limitations gracefully; teach us to be honest about ourselves and about our neighbors; teach us to be your humble servants through serving others.

A Moment of Silent Reflection

- **P** Do you acknowledge that you have sinned against God and deserve his wrath and judgment?
- Yes, I am a sinner in need of God's grace and forgiveness. I repent of my sins, those known and unknown to me. Turn me, O Holy Spirit, from my sinful ways and set me on the path of righteousness and blessedness.

- **W** We know we're supposed to examine our lives and confess our sins; we may even want to give something up as we follow Christ to the cross.
- M "Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." (Hebrews 4:16)
- **W** "Seek the LORD while he may be found; call on him while he is near." (Isaiah 55:6)
- **M** "Because of the LORD'S great love we are not consumed, for his compassion never fails. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." (Lamentations 3:22-23)
- **W** "Let the wicked forsake their ways; and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them return to the LORD, that he may have mercy on them." (Isaiah 55:7)
- M "The LORD says, 'I am he who blots out your transgressions, for my own sake, and remembers your sins no more." (Isaiah 43:25)
- "Our God will abundantly pardon." (Isaiah 55:7)
- Receive the forgiveness of our patient and compassionate God. On Calvary's cross, Jesus bore the punishment and wrath of the Father that we deserve. He gives us abundant pardon and strength to walk in his ways. Having heard your confession and by his command, I, as a called and ordained servant of Christ, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Old Testament Reading

⁵And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them.

⁶The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷And he issued a proclamation and published through Nineveh, "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything. Let them not feed or drink

water, ⁸but let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and let them call out mightily to God. Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. ⁹Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish."

¹⁰When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

Gospel Reading Matthew 20:1-16

¹[Jesus said:] "The kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. ²After agreeing with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. ³And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace, ⁴and to them he said, 'You go into the vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give vou.' ⁵So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. ⁶And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. And he said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' ⁷They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You go into the vineyard too.' 8And when evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning with

the last, up to the first.' And when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. ¹⁰Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. 11 And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, ¹²saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' ¹³But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? ¹⁴Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. 15Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' ¹⁶So the last will be first, and the first last."

- 2. How is Jesus similar to, and yet greater than, Jonah?
